For the grade of Fellow, to five Fellows.

Should an applicant for the grade of Fellow, either for direct admission or for transfer, certify that he is not personally known by five Fellows, the Board of Examiners may accept, in place thereof, references to five professional engineers of standing.

References should be selected who have personal knowledge of the applicant's electrical engineering experience.

As references occasionally fail to reply promptly to inquiries, it is suggested that applicants furnish more than the required number of names.
