Dear Mr. Meyer:

Mr. Henline has requested me to send you a copy of a paragraph relating to Mr. Lee's death contained in a letter dated March 28 from Mr. E.P.Coles, of Charlotte. It is as follows:

"We were all greatly shocked at Mr. Lee's death. He had spent two weeks at Hot Springs, Ark., and only returned to Charlotte on March 20th. At Hot Springs he contracted a cold and quite a bad cough. However, he was at his office on the morning of the 23rd. He had a stroke at the breakfast table last Saturday morning, March 24th. This stroke affected his left side. He did not recover consciousness after this stroke and died at 8:20 Saturday night. He was buried at 3 o'clock last Monday afternoon. This community as well as the country at large have sustained an irreparable loss in Mr. Lee's passing."


