### Extracts from the Constitution

#### ARTICLE II

### Qualifications for grade of Fellow

SEC. 4.—A Fellow shall be not less than thirty-two years of age and shall be either:

a. An electrical engineer by profession. As such he shall be qualified to design and to take responsible charge of important electrical work; he shall have been in the active practise of his profession for at least ten years, and shall have had responsible charge of important electrical work for at least three years; and he shall have been in good standing in the grade of Member for a period of at least five years immediately preceding the date of application for Fellow grade.

When the applicant holds in a principal national society of an allied branch of engineering, membership of a grade for which the qualifications indicate a standing equal to that required for the grade of Fellow herein, such membership shall be considered equivalent to five of the requisite ten years of active practise of the electrical profession.

b. A professor of electrical engineering or of electrical science. As such he shall have attained special distinction as an expounder

of the principles of electrical science and of electrical engineering; he shall have had at least ten years' experience as a teacher of electrical subjects, and shall have had responsible charge for three years in an electrical course of a principal school of engineering. Any years of experience as defined in paragraph "a" that the applicant may have had as an electrical engineer shall be considered the equivalent of the same number of years of experience as a "teacher of electrical subjects." He shall have been in good standing in the grade of Member for a period of at least five years immediately preceding the date of application for Fellow grade.

- c. A person who has done notable original work in electrical science of a character to give him a recognized standing equivalent to that required for Fellows under paragraphs "a" and "b."
- d. A person regularly engaged in electrical work for at least ten years, who, by inventions or by special proficiency in contributions to electrical science or the electrical arts or electrical literature has attained a standing equivalent to that required for Fellows under paragraphs "a" and "b."
- e. A person who holds in a principal national electrical engineering society of some other country membership of a grade for which the qualifications indicate a standing equivalent to that required for the grade of Fellow under "a" and "b."
