This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 10, 1943 with regard to the "Proposal for Transfer to Fellow" of J.E. Housley.

When I wrote you on April 6 with regard to the above transfer, I based my suggestion that it would be necessary to hold the transfer in abeyance on the assumption that the application would be considered under clause "a" as it did not seem to me that the work performed by Mr. Housley would meet the usual interpretation of clause "d".

I view of your request that the transfer be considered under "d", may I suggest from long experience with the Board of Examiners that you furnish, or have Mr. Housley furnish, a much more detailed statement of that part of his work which it is felt qualifies him under "d". At the present time the statement covering that part of his record is so general I am certain the Examiners would require such additional details before feeling justified in rendering an opinion on eligibility.

There is another point with which it might also be desirable to comply, i.e., a reference from the man to whom Mr. Housley reports. I believe such added support would greatly strenghten the case.

As soon as I have replies from the references now listed, and the other data necessary to complete the case, I will immediately schedule it for action by the Board of Examiners.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of April 2 submitting the proposals for transfer to the grade of Fellow of J.E. Housley and J.G. Tarboux.

We have checked over the applications referred to above and find that while apparently Dr. Tarboux'semeets all requirements with regard to an application for transfer, Mr. Housley's application does not come within the requirements as he was not admitted to Member grade until June 29, 1939 and, therefore, would not be eligible to apply for advancement to the grade of Fellow until June 29, 1944. This is in accordance with the Constitution which specifically states that all applicants for advancement to Fellow grade must have been affiliated with the Institute in the grade of Member for a period of five years immediately preceding the application for transfer. I regret, therefore, that we will have to hold Mr. Housley's application in abeyance. I assume that you will wish to explain this situation to him and I have therefore not communicated with him in any way.

With regard to Dr. Tarboux's application we will, of course, send out the reference forms to the men specified and on receipt of their replies, the application will come before the Board of Examiners for their decision.
