

### WHAT WE SEE

AND

### WHAT WE DON'T SEE.

THERE is a familiar old adage that a man can no more lift himself by his suspenders than he can climb the atmosphere by a ladder of faith. Without questioning the truth of this proverb, we are daily called upon to witness events equally strange and unaccountable.

The fact that a body of several tons weight can be suspended in the air without any visible support, is seemingly as absurd as that a man should lift himself by his suspenders, or walk upon the atmosphere. And yet it is indisputably true, as represented in the diagram.

The accompanying cut represents a bent bar of soft iron, weighing a hundred pounds, and wound around several times by insulated copper wire. This arrangement, materially considered, is but so much dead matter, incapable of attracting to itself a single grain of its own weight. But send around this coiled wire a stream of primary electricity, and like the unshorn Sampson, it springs into life, overthrows the earth's attraction, seizes upon dead matter, hugs it to its cold embrace, and there holds it with almost irresistable power. Without any iron manacles or hempen cords, or any visible support whatever, a weight of several tons is thus suspended.

After witnessing such an exhibition of incomprehensible power, who can doubt but that the powers of all other agencies in nature are weak and impotent when compared to this? Who can doubt, for a moment, that its almost omnipotent energies will yet be harnessed to machinery and made to supplant the sluggish motor forces so indifferently employed? Who can doubt that it is the prodigious power of electricity brought to bear upon the machinery of the universe, that whirls the pon-

drous planets in their spheres and sends the comet blazing

through its lightning course?

This agent or force, then, stands at the head of created substances, the most subtle, powerful and important. It works the countless myriods of chemical changes, both visible and invisible. It is the exciting cause of light and heat and the prime promoter and sustainer of both vegetable and animal existence.
