

Dear Sir:

Your letter of November 20th has just been handed me enclosing statement of dues apparently owed by Professor H.B. Smith of Princeton.

I am sorry to have to inform you that Professor
Smith has not been able to do any work since February last
and severed his connection with the Worcester Polytechnic
Institute in June. His physical and mental condition since
then has been such that I was appointed temporary conservator
of his property on July 15th. At the present time he is
entirely incapacitated mentally and physically and his resources are so meagre that I feel obliged to conserve in
every possible way. I suppose the obligation shown on
your account is a legal one, owing to the fact that his
resignation has not been tendered but I am wondering under
the circumstances if the Institute would not feel disposed
to rebate his dues for the present year.
