This statement was prepared at request of Mr. Robertson, of the Crocker-Wheeler Co. A.D.F.

SCHUYLER SKAATS WHEELER was one of nine incorporators of United Engineering Spciety in May, 1904.

This Society was created to hold and administer properties for the American Societies of Mining, Mechanical and Electrical Engineers, he being one of the three representatives of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. Later the American Society of Civil Engineers also became a member. Mr. Wheeler was a Trustee of United Engineering Society from 1904 to 1907, and its Treasurer for the year 1904-05.

In 1901 he presented to the American Institute of Electrical Engineers the remarkable collection of electrical books of the late Latimer Clark, of London, including practically every known publication in the English language previous to 1886 and many older books.

Later this collection became a part of Engineering Societies Library, owned by the four Founder Societies.

During his term as Trustee, of United Engineering Societyerected the beautiful Engineering Societies Building, 25-33 West 39th Street, New York.
