Dear Mr. Stotta

You will probably remember that at a meeting of the Board of Directors, held March 13th 1908, you read a letter from Mr. Hole of St. Petersburg, suggesting that Mr. Grafto be appointed Local Honorary Secretary for Russia. The Board of Directors authorized the President to make the appointment.

Upon investigating however, it was found that although Mr. Grafto had made application for membership and had been elected in November 1907, he had never paid the initiation fees and dues. We therefore wrote him, sending a duplicate statement and suggesting that the matter had probably been overlooked. In the meantime the appointment was not made.

We have now received a letter from Mr. Grafto, enclosing his initiation fees and dues and apologizing for the delay, which he stated, was due to his absence from St. Petersburg on official business for the Russian government.

We therefore desire to bring this matter to the atten-
