

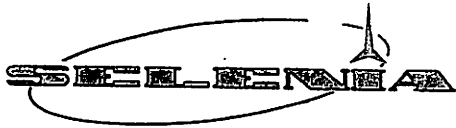

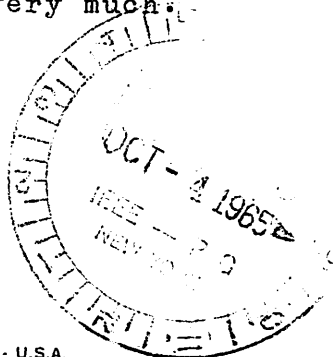

VII Comments and Recommendations:

Based on our experience in running this Symposium, I have three recommendations to make in connection with future Symposia:

1. When making up your schedule of deadline dates for submission of papers, notifying authors of acceptance, sending program material to the printer, etc, take whatever dates you decide upon and make them at least one month earlier.
2. There should be one all-inclusive registration fee which should cover all social functions such as luncheons and banquet, the Symposium Digest, and any other costs associated with the Symposium. The most annoying and bothersome duty for the Symposium Committee was to try and sell Luncheon and Banquet tickets and to give the Hotel an attendance figure for the affairs. It is strongly recommended that if the Symposium Committee decides to hold this type of social functions, that their cost be included in the registration fee. Raising the fee to \$25.00 is not excessive for attendance for a three day symposium, with a reduced rate for attendance on the last day only.

VII Comments and Recommendations (Continued)

3. Another problem we encountered late in the preparation for the Symposium was the policy for admission of Exhibitor personnel to the Exhibit Area and to Technical Sessions and the number of free passes to be given to each Exhibitor. This was not satisfactorily settled by us but should be considered early in the preparation for the Symposium and included in the Exhibitor Contracts.
