Dear Mr. Schwenk:

Thank you for your invitation of March 11 to attend a meeting for the purpose of determining interest in organizing a group active in the radio frequency interference field. At this time I am not certain that I will be able to attend your meeting on April 10 because of the distance, but I should like to make a few comments.

I have watched with interest the development of the Radio Interference Technical Committee on the West Coast, and have observed the considerable amount of difficulty in getting the organization going. I personally feel that part of the difficulty here was due to the rather ambitious program which was undertaken to begin with, and that in organizing the group here one should proceed on a more spontaneous basis.

One of the things that struck me about R.I.T.C.'s operations was the point that a lot of information has been exchanged among the active members on a rather unofficial basis. I feel there is a strong need for a means of exchanging information of a technical nature in this field, and would recommend that a new group look at this as its primary function.

I therefore encourage the organization of a group for the purpose of presenting technical papers of either advanced or tutorial nature (depending upon the requirements of the membership). If I cannot attend the meeting, I should very much like to be kept informed of the proceedings and would be glad to assist in any way that I can. I assure you that you have the support of the group working in this field here.


Dear Mr. Kant:


