
Gentlemen:

Your form letter of 11 March 1957 represents, I believe, an excellent proposal for further uniting the efforts of those interested in the important problems of RF interference. It is reassuring to see someone willingly undertake this organizing effort, which is necessary, though not usually very rewarding to the men who undertake it.

As our technology grows and expands this problem must receive more and more engineering attention. While I can understand the engineering problem quite sympathetically, it does not represent my direct interest. I am especially interested in the operator problems which arise as a consequence of uncontrolled or incompletely controlled interference. One of the reasons for this interest is that the results of incompletely controlled interference may produce another kind of interference which arises within the central nervous system of the operator who makes use of an equipment showing RF interference. Thus there are not only the losses and degradations commonly recognized by engineering measurements but to all of this there may be added still more loss (when operators are involved) due to characteristics of the human nervous system.

I am not sure whether the human engineering interest just mentioned would serve to enrich the perspective and content of problems for the proposed group or whether it would represent a diversion from problems that are already complex enough. In any case I hope to attend the 10 April 1957 organizational meeting and see what direction the group proposes to take. If, by chance, I cannot attend please be assured of our encouragement and best wishes for success. If we can aid you in any way in this venture, please feel free to call.






Your kind invitation of 11 March 1957 to attend a meeting on the formation of an electromagnetic interference organization is appreciated.

Secondly, as a member of the Armed Forces and Director, Communications Department, Army Signal Engineering Laboratories, I regard your endeavor as a potential source of assistance to the Army program of electromagnetic interference reduction. As General Cook indicated at the recent National Conference on Interference Reduction, the Army has been privileged to enjoy a rather fine spirit of cooperation among the industries and government in the area of compliance with interference reduction specifications. It is anticipated that your organization will enhance and broaden this basis of understanding.

I have discussed your ideas with members of my organization and you will hear from them as individuals.

May I suggest that your organization be patterned after the form of the Radio Interference Technical Committee.

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
